Wild Instincts was looking for volunteers, I knew that I had the right person for that. Lance B approached me several months ago in regards to volunteering. He has volunteered at the food pantry and meals on wheels; however it just wasn't what he wanted to do.
"I want to work with animals" he expressed to me.
Wild Instincts is a wildlife rehabilitation center that is available for animal emergencies 24 hours a day. Sharon Larson and Mark Naniot have been mending injured wildlife for years. Their main goal is to rehabilitate and then release back into the wild.

I contacted Sharon in the beginning of the summer to express Headwater's would like to help. After discussing what jobs were needed to be done, paperwork and phone calls, Lance B had his volunteer site.

July 28, 2015 was Lance's first day on the job with his job coach Peter. Lance's job is to cut up and prepare food for the animals. Lance understands that these animals are wild and are to be released back into the wild so it is very important to remain quiet and calm while working so as to not disturb the animals.

Lance has not only fulfilled his duties preparing food for the animals and weekly yard work at the facility, but had asked staff at Headwater's Inc. to donate any venison or fish to help feed the animals at Wild Instincts. On September 2, 2015 Linnea Sandberg

(Financial Assistant at Headwaters) brought in 2 hind quarters of venison and a large container of frozen fish.

Lance was so pleased to bring these items to Wild Instincts. Thank you Linnea for this wonderful donation, and thank you Lance and Peter for your huge commitment to volunteering at Wild Instincts. - Mary P
