October is Down Syndrome Awareness Month

October is Down Syndrome Awareness Month, a chance to spread awareness. During the month of October, we celebrate people with Down syndrome and make people aware of our abilities and accomplishments. It's not about celebrating disabilities, it's about celebrating abilities.

Down syndrome is a genetic disorder caused when abnormal cell division results in extra genetic material from chromosome 21. Down syndrome causes a distinct facial appearance, intellectual disability, developmental delays, and may be associated with thyroid or heart disease. Early intervention programs with a team of therapists and special educators who can treat each child's specific situation are helpful in managing Down syndrome.

Down Syndrome Facts:

- ~Down syndrome occurs when an individual has a full or partial extra copy of chromosome 21.
- ~Down syndrome occurs in people of all races and economic levels.
- ~There are three types of Down syndrome: trisomy 21 (accounts for 95% of cases), translocation and mosaicism.
- ~Down syndrome is the most commonly occurring chromosomal condition.
- ~People with Down syndrome have an increased risk for certain medical conditions.
- ~All people with Down syndrome experience cognitive delays, and the effect is usually mild to moderate.
- ~Positive support from family, friends and the community enable people with Down syndrome to lead fulfilling and productive lives.
- ~People with Down syndrome attend school, work, have meaningful relationships, vote, and contribute to society in many wonderful ways.
